Common types of labels include circuit identification labels, which indicate the specific circuits within the panel, and warning labels that highlight potential hazards such as high voltage.

Cable trays containing conductors operating over 600 volts shall have a permanent, legible warning notice carrying the wording "DANGER - HIGH VOLTAGE - KEEP AWAY" placed in a ...

Cable trays containing conductors rated over 600 volts shall have a permanent, legible warning notice carrying the wording "DANGER -- HIGH VOLTAGE -- KEEP AWAY" placed in a readily visible ...

These informative notices are posted near high voltage equipment and machinery to discourage unauthorized entry to the area and help prevent electrocution injuries or death.

A permanent, legible, warning notice worded "Danger-High Voltage" must be placed in a conspicuous place at all entrances and access points to substations with a requirement not to exceed 10 feet in all ...

Overloading cable trays can lead to a breakdown of the tray, its connecting points and/or supports, causing hazards to persons underneath the cable tray and even leading to possible electric shock ...

In industrial settings, trays may support raceways and boxes if designed for the load, using appropriate clamps and fasteners. Additionally, trays carrying high-voltage conductors must display clear warning ...

In general, cable trays containing conductors operated at over 600 volts must have a permanent, legible warning notice carrying the wording "DANGER--HIGH VOLTAGE--KEEP AWAY" placed in a ...
