A junction box provides a code-approved place to house wire connections, whether for outlets, switches, or splices. Here's how to install one.

Take off the cover plate of the electrical junction box first. Then open or remove the two knockouts on the box to insert both sets of wires inside the box using cable clamps to secure them.
